June 30, 1947 - May 25, 2018

Surrounded by his loving family, Doug's life on earth ended peacefully on May 25, 2018 at the age of 70 in High River following a 4-year battle with ALS that he fought with courage and strength. Doug's journey into eternity began at the same time and we know he was welcomed by his Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, with the words, "Well done, my good and faithful servant. Your reward is waiting for you."

Doug is survived by his loving family, wife, Rita of 47 years; two children, Kim (Ryan) White of Bastrop, LA; Derek (Darcie) of Corunna, ON; five grandchildren Cole, Angelina, Annalise, Archer, Daniel.
