“ First off, let me say I'm sorry to hear of Doug's passing. I have been thinking of getting in touch with him for some time, and I'm sorry I didn't get a chance to connect.

When we were both employees of Nova, I worked with Doug on a project in Turkey. He had a great interest in exploring the landscape, and was instrumental in organizing two weekend trips in which we climbed a couple of high volcanoes.

Our first outing began soon after midnight, as we got an early start on climbing Mt. Erciyes. We reached the top in mid-morning, just in time for thunder clouds to roll in, and we got the hell off the summit as quickly as possible! We slid down snow 3000 feet for more.

the second trip was a climb up Mt Hasan Dag. My wife was driving the car, accompanied by my one-year-old daughter, so we got a late start, around noon. By 6 PM, we still had not reached the summit, but were close to the snow line. I was holding Doug back, so I encouraged him to forge on ahead to the Summit. I pulled my paraglider out of its bag and made the first ever flight off this volcano. I reached our rendezvous Village in late evening, but Doug was not there. I met my wife in a residents home, and we were very happy when Doug burst through the door sometime after dark. He had been lucky to find a snow gully that allowed him to slide down thousands of feet in a quick descent.

Sadly, after Doug returned to Canada, I lost touch with him and we shared no more adventures together.
