Mr. John E. Guthrie formerly of Pinawa, Manitoba died quietly & peacefully in the early hours on May 7, 2018 at High River, Alberta.

John was born in Montreal, Quebec on September 25, 1926 to parents Janet & John Guthrie. He was predeceased by his parents; infant son John; granddaughter Kyla and his wife and soulmate Gladys.

John is survived by his 2 daughters Trisha (Bill) van Erp of Sunnyvale, California, Beth (Paul) Lievaart of Nanton, Alberta; Grandchildren Brianna (Tim), Erin (Will), Alissa (Jose), Brian (De) and Megan; as well as his great-grandchildren William, Eva, Emily, Angel and Nathan.
