



Mr. Clark Louis Schlosser

April 7, 1942 - January 31, 2024

Clark Louis Schlosser was born April 7, 1942 in Claresholm AB and passed away on January 31, 2024 at the age of 81 years

He was pre-deceased by his parents Lloyd and Jennie Schlosser and his brother Merlin (5 yrs old)

Clark is survived by his wife of 62 years, Ethel; daughters JoAnn (Mike) Sears, Diane (Cody) Sawley, Sonya Moir, Naomi (Jay) Blake. He is also survived by his brother Wayne Schlosser, sister Gloria Schwartz and numerous nieces and nephews.

Clark married Ethel Blades March 17, 1962 and they lived on their ranch west of Stavely until they moved to their new home west of Nanton in 1998.

Clark was a well respected member of the professional rodeo community, serving as a judge for many years after retiring from active rodeo. He competed in steer wrestling, calf roping, wild horse race and wild cow milking

He played hockey for the Nanton Palominos and Stavely Spurs in the AA Ranchland Hockey league for many years, then with the Foothills old timers until he was about 60.

Clark was always an avid hunter with one of his first memorable hunts at the age of 14 when he went on a sheep hunt at the head of the Oldman river with his Brother Wayne, Maxine, and Donny Williams.

He enjoyed golfing and was a member of the Nanton Golf Club. He was a member of the Stavely Elks receiving his 60 year pin in 2023.

“ From Jöyce and I, our most sincere condolences to the entire Schlosser family.

My first intro to Clark was at Tom Bews steer wrestling school at Bob Winthrops arena in 1972. I was having hell getting off the first time, so Bews put a nylon rope around my neck, and handed the rope to Clark who was hazing. He said to Clark, “if he don’t get off, dally up and drag him off”. I looked at Clark and knew for certain he would get er done. Before I nodded Bews took the loop off, nodded and got off nowhere near the steer.

Clark and I were last bulldoggers at Bassano afternoon perf and were up in Swift Current first section of the evening perf. I was driving my out fit, and back then the Trans Canada was a 2 lane and super busy. I was passing with not a lot of room to spare. Clark never said a word, just sat over on the passenger side sharpening his Jack knife. That sucker must have been sharp because he got to sharpening pretty fast the odd time!

I got to witness an old time bar room brawl at Burks Place in Morris MB. A 300 lb bouncer knocked Tom Ivan’s out, Clark knocked the bouncer out, Dick McPeak chased another bouncer around and around a table, never caught him, Billy Maughn clobbered another bouncer coming up the stairs, Benny Hern cooled a guy who tried to cut in on his dancer. All this happened within a few short minutes. I bent down, picked up Ivan’s, put him over my shoulder and carried him out through the restaraunt where we were stopped by the local constabulary.

Mostly I remember Clark as a great cowboy, a fine friend and fun travelling partner. Clark and Tom showed me the merits of good Scoth whiskey. Unfortunately, I can not attend his memorial, we are away. However, I know in my heart the love from his friends and family will fill southern Alberta. RIP my friend.
