One of the true Alberta pioneers, Dorothy Louise (nee: Hartell) Davis passed away peacefully surrounded by her family on November 21st, 2011 at the High River Hospital. Predeceased by her husband Roy in March, 2001 and her sisters and brothers-in-law Molly and Frank Duxbury, Vi and Tom Gilchrist and Vern Feddersen.
