September 6, 1937 - December 10, 2024

She was born into the farming family of EJ and Alma Berg as the youngest of five children. Gladys married AJ Cameron in 1956 and had three children with him. Clayton (Edna) Cameron, Colleen (Michael) McLaren and Sheila (Warren) Clendining. She was divorced in 1980 and remarried to Les Kirton in 1984. Gladys and Les were happily married until his passing in 2001.

After many years living alone, Gladys met John Farber in 2011 and they shared a wonderful friendship, travelling to the Dominican Republic, Alaska and the East coast with him and other family members. She was very sad to lose him in 2017.

Gladys is predeceased by her brothers Eilef and George, and her sister Marie. Mourned by her oldest sister Mabel.

Gladys lived and worked in High River from 1968 to the present. She worked at the High River Meat Market for many years, and then went on to get her Registered Nursing Assistant and worked at the High River Hospital until she retired. Gladys lived in her own home until the end. She was never alone during her last years. Her granddaughter Rachael Gomez lived with her or came in to look after her along with her son Clayton and his wife Edna -who took turns to stay with her. Her granddaughter Addi McLaren took a few weeks every summer to stay with GG, as did her daughter Colleen.

Granddaughter Kyle McLaren came once a week to do GG's hair and visit or would stay if anyone had other places they had to be. These people made it possible for Gladys to live in her own home until the very end, which was her most fervent wish.

She will be missed terribly by her three children, 15 grandchildren, 12 great grandchildren and 1 great great grandchild.

A Funeral Service will be held at the High River United Church on Tuesday, December 17th at 1:00 p.m. with interment to follow at the Highwood Cemetery.

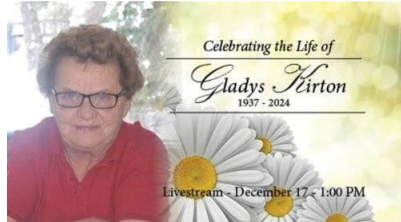
