I met Gregg, in Calgary, the summer of 1978. We met through our respective mutual friends who were renting a character home on 33 St. SW, in a neighborhood now known as Marda Loop. The occupants of the house, who all became our life-long friends (such as now deceased Launie Cuthbert aka Bird/Dunnigan, Bob Brennon aka Booby, Darryl Gerieux aka-Spook, and Jim Linkletter aka Linky) were almost all under 22 years of age. Gregg and I fit in well with everyone we met there, as we were both young (he was 21 and I was 19), and liked to chase girls and party it up. In other words, we started our friendship and friendships with all our soon to be life-long friends, as adolescent hedonists! It's impossible for me to say when we transitioned from adolescence to manhood, but together we - slowly and imperceptively - made that transition. In short, Gregg and I grew up together. With that in mind, I'm lucky and grateful to the greater power of the universe for providing me with a true friend like Gregg. It is, therefore, with a heavy heart that I must say bon voyage to my friend Gregg, who I counted as a friend amongst the fingers of my hand...
