“ I had lost Jan's number so during a recent search on the web to find it, I was devastated to hear of her passing. What a joyful, brilliant, sensitive spirit she was with the most wry hilarious sense of humour.

Jan and I met at a summer camp in Haliburton. We instantly clicked as friends having many of the same interests. She was Senior staff and I was a Counsellor. She ran the nature program and I assisted her. Now this was not the most popular program at the camp so we decided to jazz it up a bit by creating a skit. She portrayed mother nature and I was daughter nature. We dressed in overalls, flannel shirts and spoke in southern accents pretending we were identifying constellations and watching a meteor shower. That melodramatic display upped our numbers for awhile! That year Jan had just started Acadia U in Nova Scotia and painted such a beautiful picture of the campus and surrounding area that I followed the next year and visited with she and her then husband Gordon often where they were living in the Gasperau Valley. We saw each other often when they moved to the Waterloo area and I visited a couple of times in High River. During one visit she arranged a horse back riding day with a local neighbor who gave tours of a local valley by horse back. I had never ridden a horse before but was game so off we went. Jan was a great rider, me not so much but the day was a fascinating history of the area and beautiful scenery. Unfortunately I did not realize I was allergic to horses so by the time the ride was over I was in full allergic reaction with eyes nearly shut from swelling and suffering from hives. Jan took great care of me between stifled bouts of laughter at the look of me. When I saw myself in the mirror I was surprised she was able to suppress her laughter as long as she did. Over the years we sent cards to one another and then unfortunately lost touch until about 3 yrs ago when she called out of the blue and we picked up where we left off. I am so sorry for your loss. I hope wonderful memories of her humanity and escapades have comforted you over the last 7 mos. She was a bright light in my life and I will never forget our friendship.
