Kelvin Joseph Holitzki, born May 18th, 1954, passed away at the age of 70 in Calgary on August 3rd, 2024.

Kelvin was born in Edmonton where he spent his first 15 years. The family then moved to Calgary where Kelvin stayed until relocating to High River in 2014.

Kelvin attended St. Mary's High school, the University of Calgary, and SAIT where he earned a programming certificate. He worked in IT and computer programming for the Credit Union, Telus, and Alberta Health Services. He had a love of learning that saw him enrolling in various continuing education classes, both in computer technology and fields of interest, such as woodworking and welding. He continued his love of creativity and craftsmanship by pursuing woodworking and 3D printing.

Kelvin was highly involved in his community and gave of himself through acts of service. He held leadership, committee, and treasurer roles in organization such as St. Michael's Catholic Church, Knights of Columbus, Toastmasters, Children in Dance, High River Pickleball Club, Fairway Greens condo board, and the Highwood Men's Senior Golf League.

Above all, Kelvin cherished his family and friends. His kindness, good humour, and quick wit will be lovingly remembered by his wife Cindy; daughters Janice

Dougherty (Christopher) and Laura Wellsman (Nathan); siblings Donalda Paton (Brad), Blaine (Anne), Mark (Sarah Rudd), Rae Rees (Doug); grandson Cecil Dougherty; as well as nieces, nephews, and godchildren. He was predeceased by his parents Martin and Marian, and brother Keith.

We reminisced about our teenage golfing years at Shaganappi.

It helped shape Kelvin and all of us.

Kelvin was a man of integrity, honesty, kindness, generosity ,competitiveness, humility, and he relished the occasional bragging rightsstrutting off the green after posting a birdie He was always striving to better himself at the game he loved.

As we Facetimed we also talked about his accomplishments as a woodworker and 3d

printer. He showed me numerous projects and examples of his work and I was amazed

at his skill and what he had accomplished. He was particularly proud of the wooden

truck he made for his grandson using various types of native and exotic woods

He also sent me photos of the gazebo he built and the Zen garden he and Cindy created to complement this beautiful structure. It was a very contemplative and peaceful landscape space. Kelvin was a very talented man.*

During one of our conversations he changed the angle of his phone and the camera picked up the wall behind him. Over his shoulder I could see a crucifix on the wall and it appeared to be illuminated by either an overhead spot light or a narrow beam of sunshine. It seemed to be aglow on the wall. It struck me as very symbolic I think his faith contributed to giving him the strength to endure the ravages he experienced. I sensed he seemed to be at peace with his destiny and resigned to the unfair fate which was soon to befall him. He was comforted by the fact that he left a legacy as a loving husband, father, grandfather, and brother. Family was most valued.

I think he was very confident of his place in the afterlife...he was a good man....and he courageously went forward....inquisitive and stoic and proud.
