“ I first met Mel when he first moved to High River. I was awe struck by his ability to play such a broad spectrum of music. At that time he was struggling to care for his very precious son and daughter. Very shortly he was looking for a place to teach and share his knowledge of the guitar. I adapted and rented him a small space and often enjoyed standing around the corner and listening to talent in its blossoming. Mel loved to share with his students. I recall him teaching one student for free rather than him leave because his father had lost his job due to economic disruptions. I also recall one of his students having problems with her university music course. She was having problems with an assignment. He took time out of his day and shortly helped her to the right track. My own son took lessons from Mel for many years. I once asked him if he wanted to quit and the answer was "No Way". An answer I am sure that would have been echoed by many of his students.

Aside from his teaching Mel contributed to the music scene in the foothills area surrounding High River and its surrounding neighbors. Much of this performing was done to help others and he received little or no compensation, especially during the Christmas Season. I recall in 2008, Mel was MC - ing a show arranged by his very close friend Jeff Bradshaw. The premier star of the show was Don Helms who played steel guitar on almost all of Hank Williams recordings. When Don arrived he informed them that he much preferred to play to accompaniment rather than play solo. Mel was called upon as he knew many of Hanks songs. After the first song, Don turned to Mel, smiled and commented to the audience, " got a live one here" Little did he know the extent that that statement could cover.

Mel was a giving man and High River and surrounding area should be proud to have been blessed by him. I know that I am proud to have called him a very dear friend!!
