It is with profound grief that I, Loyce Clarke, announce the death of my beloved husband Bob at the High River Hospital on December 17, 2013, We met in 1952, married in 1954 and welcomed two cherished children, Nancy in 1959 and Stan in 1961. Bob was a loving and generous husband, and excellent provider and a super Dad. As a young family we spent summers in the mountain hiking and camping, in the winters we skied there. Bob enjoyed a lifetime of volunteering for his church, his community and his children's activities, especially speed swimming. He became an International Starter and we worked many international swim meets together. After 20 years of owning his own business Bob retired in 1993. First he volunteered at Fort Calgary and then at Canada Olympic Park. He was very proud of the 8,000 very happy and productive hours he volunteered at C.O.P. We were fortunate to have the opportunity to travel across Canada, the U.S., Ecuador, Mexico and Europe. Bob was predeceased by our daughter Nancy in 2011 and is survived by her sons James and Stephen. He is also survived by our son Stan, his wife Joyce and their two girls Jessica and Emily.
