Mr. William (Bill) Rowley passed away on May 1, 2026 at Intercare Chinook Long Term Care in Calgary at the age of 84 years.

He and Dorothy then moved to Black Diamond then Calgary and ended up in High River for their later years. He was always concerned for their wellbeing. Bill was a man of good character and high integrity with a strong work ethic who lived that example. He was always quick

to help with any project but didn't often ask for help. He once shared, "Two things in my life I have never regretted; having Christ as Lord of my life and marrying your mother".

Bill is predeceased by his wife of 59 years Dorothy (2020), infant son Donald Hugh (1963), and son-in-law Howard Brososky (2026).

“Grandpa Rowley was the only grandfather I had in my life, so he had two pairs of shoes to fill, but I think he filled six or seven, probably more. He was wise, humble, devoted, silly, compassionate, and loving. When I think about Grandpa, a lot of things come to mind. I think about all the wooden whistles he made for me, or the first time we caught a fish and got to eat it. I never knew fish had so many bones until then. I think about him letting me play pool and darts at the Senior’s Centre when old Ralph wasn’t looking. I think about him pulling money out of my ear at Callaway Park lineups, and laughing at my stupid jokes. I think about him and Grandma driving to Kelowna twice in 24 hours because they couldn’t find us, or something like that. It was probably my dad’s fault but they came back anyway. I think about him and Grandma visiting me all the way in Victoria when I was in college. They had like a hundred descendants and still had time for all of us. I think about that time Grandpa and I were building a desk and I drilled through his hand by accident. I was mortified, figured he’d need a new finger or something, but he just looked at it and said something like “what did you do that for?” and let out his classic wheezy Grandpa laugh. To this day I’ve never met anyone with skin as thick as Grandpa’s, and I mean that in more ways than one. I also remember the first time I got a hug instead of a hand shake from Grandpa, and I wasn’t sure what was happening or why. But whether it was a hug or a hand shake, what I’ll remember most from Grandpa is the love that he radiated. He didn’t have to say it or show it or hug it onto me. In Grandpa’s presence I always knew that I was loved, not for the things I did or said, but simply for being. I was loved because I was his grandson, and I always knew that in his presence I was acknowledged, accepted, and welcome. The door to his home and his heart were always open, and for that I know that Heaven’s gates are wide open for him. So even though I’ll miss Grandpa’s peaceful, steadfast presence, I’m joyful knowing he’s with Grandma and everyone else up there, rejoicing in a new, everlasting life.
